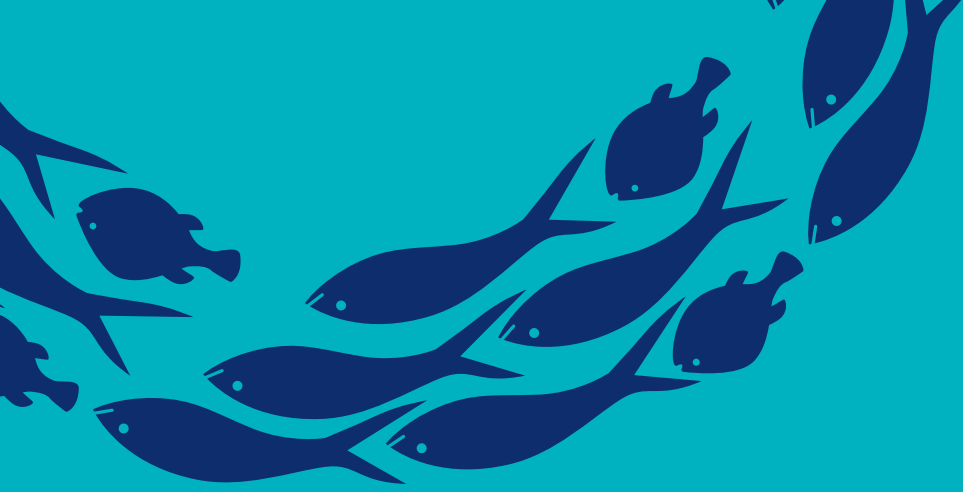

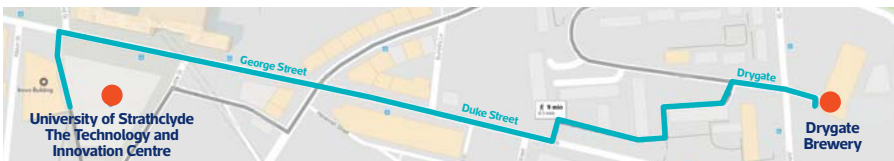
Event dinner

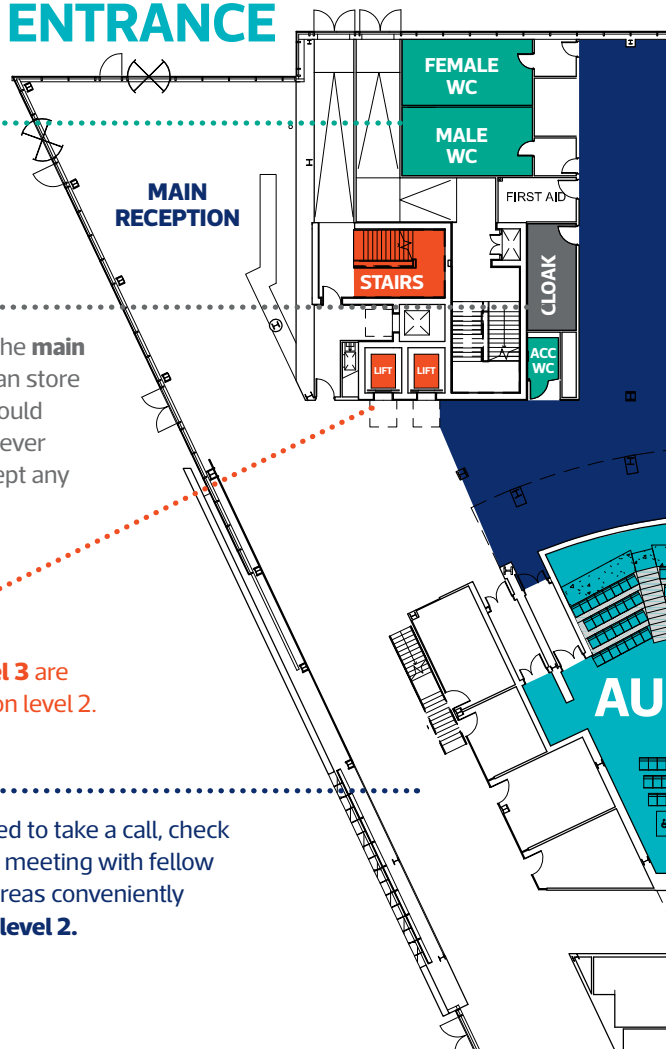
■ Getting to the break-out groups

■ Seating areas

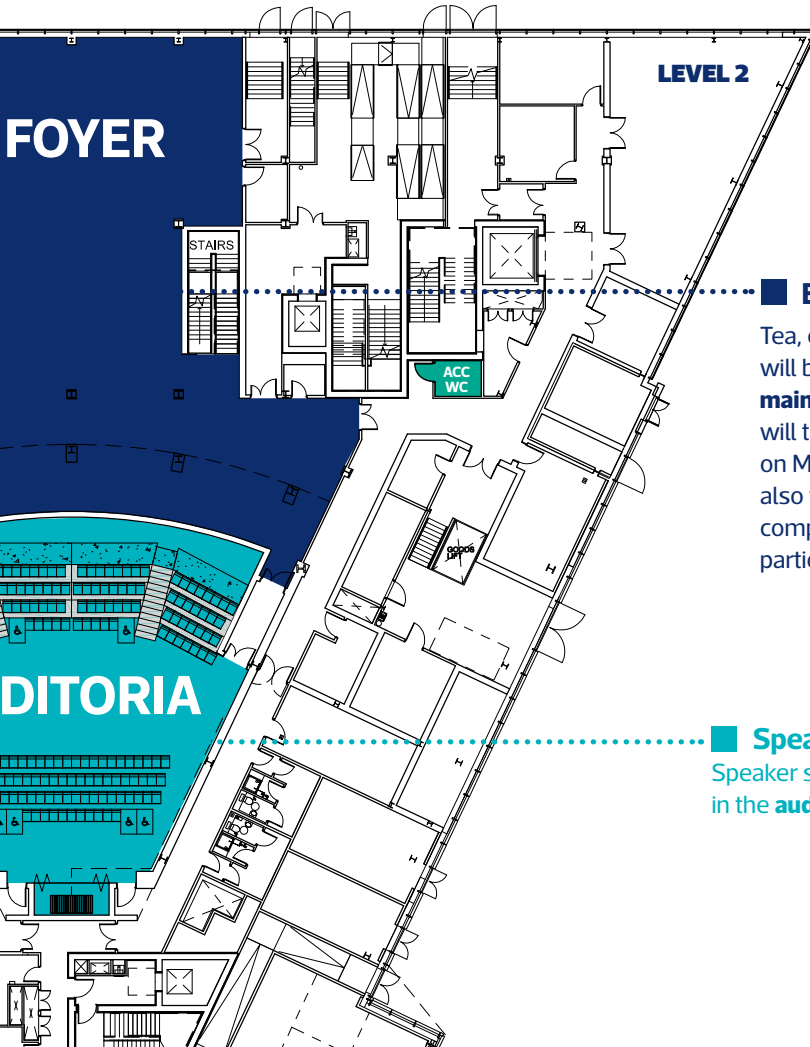
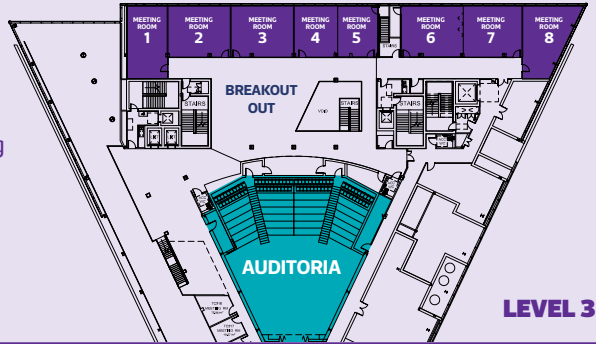
For those times when you need to take a call, check emails or want an impromptu meeting with fellow delegates, there are seating areas conveniently located off the **main foyer** on **level 2**.
